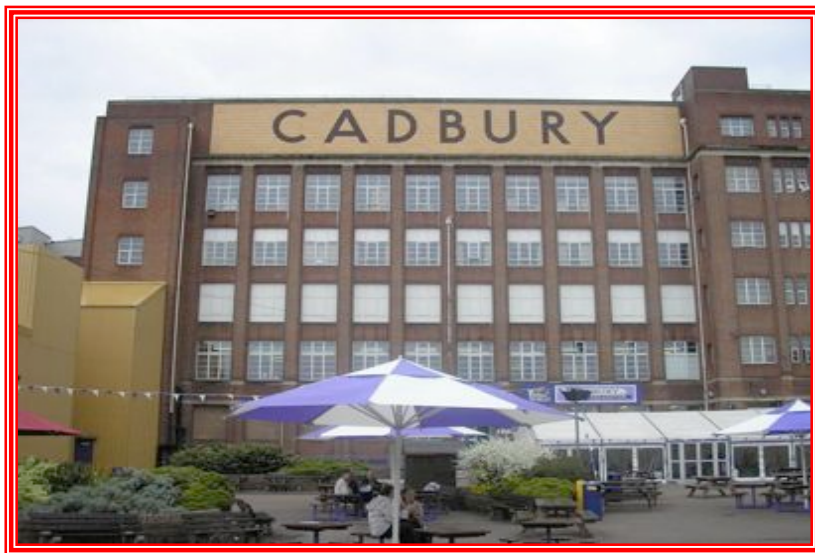


# YEAR 3

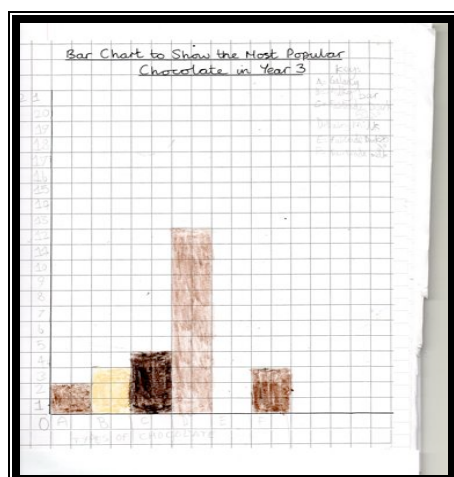
On the day of the trip the children and adults tried very hard to contain their excitement. A great day was had by all and the children proved to be great representatives of Allesley Hall.

We continued with our theme of chocolate in Numeracy where we conducted a blind tasting to determine the most popular type of chocolate in Year 3.

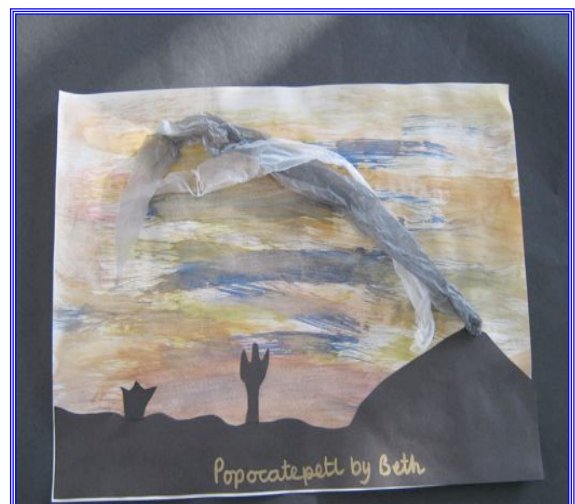
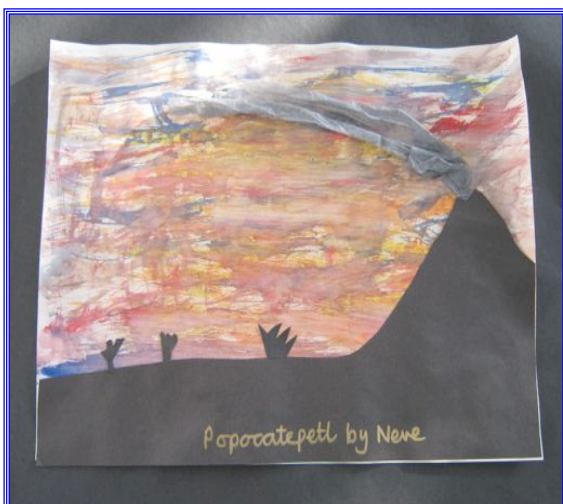
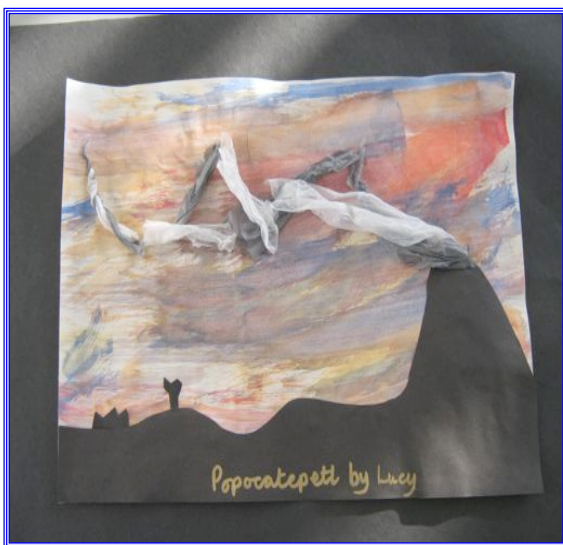


As you can see, along with the rest of the nation, Cadbury Dairy Milk is our favourite chocolate.
